Dallas Area Classic Chevys CHRISTMAS Project Wheelchair Ramp Build - Saturday, December 8th - 7:45AM

For the past several years, members of DAAC have been most generous with their time and labor in supporting the Dallas Ramp Project. Our leader on this project Larry Rollow has been involved with this organization for about 7 years. For those of you that are not familiar with the DRP, this is a not-for-profit, IRS certified 501C-3 organization. Every dollar donated to the DRP, that same dollar ends up in a wheelchair ramp. EVERYONE involved are volunteers. We will assemble a ramp using pre-built modules that we take out to the job site. Each ramp is different, owing to the fact that each home is different. Ramps are built using guidelines set down by the Americans With Disabilities Act. We will meet at the warehouse at 7:45 AM, load the materials on our pickup trucks and proceed to the job site, quite often in South or East Dallas. We will divide into teams of about 4 to 6 volunteers and each team will be led by a DRP designated "team leader" (Larry is one). If you have a 3/8 chuck, reversible, variable speed drill, please bring it, either corded or cordless. If you don't have one, that is OK, we have a few spares. We use a #2 square bit to drive in deck screws in assembling the ramp, I will have a few extra bits with me. The Dallas Ramp Project website is www.dallasramps.org for more information. The address of the warehouse is 4720 Simonton Road in Dallas This is between Inwood Rd and Welch Rd, a couple of blocks north of LBJ Freeway, just to the west of the Freeds warehouse in the back. Go to the Dallas Ramp website and click on volunteer and then click on where to volunteer for a map of the location of the warehouse. Please contact Larry Rollow (972.960.1408 or Idrollow@sbcglobal.net) as soon as you can if you plan on attending so we can plan our jobs for that day. If the weather is bad, call Larry in the morning or check the DACC website for a decision if we will build or not.



I started working on cars when I was just a kid, and it's been a hobby all my life. I built 1968 Camaros for each of my 3 kids when they turned 16, restored a 1968 Corvette Stingray convertible in the mid-1990's, and worked on a lot of cars in between. But I always wanted to restore a real classic, a 1957 Chevy Bel Air 2-door hardtop. I waited until just the right opportunity came along, and that was in November 2002.

I found the frame and body on ebay one day, and it looked promising. Instead of bidding on it, I talked the guy into letting me negotiate for it over the phone, and we made a deal. The next day, I drove out to Van, Texas, and found what I was looking for sitting in the middle of a field. I brought it home on a trailer that day. Denise and all my neighbors thought I'd lost my mind, and couldn't imagine what I was going to do with such a piece of junk! But I knew it was going to be a beauty.

I started work on it in May 2003. I had to do major sheet metal repair, changed out the rear end and installed disc brakes in the front. I put a 327 in it, and I did all the painting, Victory Red. I cleaned up and used as many parts as I could, and bought new ones when I couldn't find what I wanted anywhere else. Normally I take care of the interior work, but this time I wanted something special. I installed the carpet, dash and gauges, and built a custom console. Then I took the car to Morris Custom Upholstery and had them cover the seats, door panels and install the headliner. They did a great job. I did all the other work, and believe it or not, did it all in a 2-car garage at home, even the painting!

I took my time, and after some long waits for parts and a few delays, I finished it in 2005. I added some special touches of my own, like a cover for the spare tire, which Morris also helped with, and a compartment in the trunk to keep my cleaning supplies. I'm proud of the way my '57 turned out. We have a great time taking it out for shows and just driving it through town. We enjoy belonging to Dallas Area Classic Chevys, and appreciate the recognition we've gotten for our classic '57.


